From the Rabbi

In my last letter to our community I succumbed somewhat to a spirit of pessimism and disappointment concerning the lack of enthusiasm and real involvement shown in recent months by many of our members.

Unfortunately there was only a limited response to my letter - a few new faces in Shule, a few more young women to help with the Ladies Auxiliary, but no real active change for the better.

Perhaps I am asking too much from our community which has gone through such a radical change in membership over the last year or two. After all, our attendances for all three services on Shabbat are quite good. Functions and classes etc. have been taking place. Obviously, from the lack of criticism, constructive or otherwise, our community must be satisfied.

Therefore, rather than launching into an all-out pep-talk similar to my last letter, I shall confine this Rosh Hashanah message to a very simple request.

I would simply like to ask every one of our members to take-off some time in the coming weeks to consider the message and importance of the coming High Holydays. I am not asking for long-range commitments, but rather that every member of our community should make an all-out effort to attempt to capture the meaning of these days by attending services, and if you already plan to attend, by attempting to follow and understand what is actually taking place.

In this way, each and every one of us can ensure a more positive and viable commitment to our heritage and to all things Jewish - which will naturally stem from spending the High Holyday season in a meaningful manner. The services, the prayers, the customs and rituals are all so beautiful and profound that they must effect a sincere person in a positive manner.

To assist in such a resolution, this Journal has been dedicated to recording many features and explanations concerning the current festive period. Services in the synagogue will be geared to enable them to be as simple, yet as inspiring, as possible, without the delays and lengthiness that has occured in recent years. Page numbers will be announced at important sections. I will attempt to present sermons and announcements which will be as enlightening as possible, in an attempt to help all present to capture the spirit of the day.

The fact that Rosh Hashanah and Succot fall on week-ends, and Yom Kippur on a public holyday, should act as a further boost to enable each of us to respond to the message and meaning of these days, and to ensure that attendances will be at an all-time high.

If you would like to purchase a copy of the Birenbaum Machzor (the High Holidays' Prayer Book used in our Synagogue - which has a very readable translation) or a Tallit, or if you would like any other information or assistance please do not hesitate to contact me. May I also suggest that you ensure the reservation of seats in the synagogue, if

you have not already done so, by calling the Honorary Treasurer, Dr E. Fitchman on 642.8530 immediately.

May I conclude with the wish that our community as a whole will be moved to a much stronger and dedicated commitment to all things Jewish. In this manner we will surely merit all the bountiful blessings of the Almighty for a truly happy, healthy and prosperous New Year for ourselves and our dear ones, and also for the strengthening of peace and happiness for our people everywhere, and in the Holy Land in particular.

EXCERPTS FROM THE PRESIDENTS' ANNUAL REPORT - 1979.

One of this years' major events was the change in administration of our Kindergarten. The Yolanda Kramer Kindergarten is now being administered by the NSW Board of Jewish Education since the first school term of 1979. Though we were faced with many problems at first, the situation has taken a definite turn to the better and is now running quite smoothly. The main beneficieries will, of course, be the children of our community, who receive a sound basis in our religion and at the same time a first- class pre-school education.

The Sunday School classes are progressing very satisfactorally with an enrolment of 40 children. Childrens' attendances on Tuesday afternoons are also very encouraging and thanks must go to our Rabbi's and Rebbetzin's dedication and continued effort.

The Ladies Auxiliary is again to be applauded for a magnificent and concerted effort throughout the year. The funds raised by them compare favourably with the previous year, but do not compensate for our increased costs.

I attribute such deficiencies to the congregation's complete reliance on membership fees and donations which have been kept at constant unchanged levels despite the yearly increase in expenditure. I therefore use this opportunity to appeal to all members to make allowance for inflation and to increase regular donations etc. accordingly. I also appeal to all members to settle all outstanding pledges and donations. All members,

except those suffering genuine hardship, should also pay all membership and seat-rentals promptly and in full.

I extend thanks to Rabbi and Rebbetzin Gutnick for their devotion and dedication. We were happy to welcome them back after their leave overseas last year, when they attended the wedding of the Rebbetzin's brother in Israel. We wish them Mazeltov on this occasion and also on the recent occasion of their son, Mendy's, first hair cut which was celebrated in the traditional manner at a third birthday party to which all members were invited. A wonderful time was had by all, and in particular by Mendy!

Thanks and appreciation are also extended to two outstanding personalities in our community who last year were our Chattan Torah and Chattan Bereishit, I refer, of course to Alderman John Lutman, Mayor of Burwood, and Mr Arthur Kohn. We are indebted to their generousity and support throughout the entire year.

We thank WIZO Tikvah and Negba for their much appreciated support and contribution to the community. The ladies of WIZO and the Ladies Auxiliary work hand-in-hand to ensure the success of our annual Fete and other such ventures.

Mazel Tov to all those who had simchot during the past year. An up-to-date list is found elsewhere in the Journal. We thank all concerned for their support of the synagogue at such times and also our Rabbi for his assistance in making each occasion a success.

We suffered a very deep loss on the passing of Mr J. Nagel. A plaque in his memory was dedicated by the community in the foyer of the synagogue. Despest condolances are expressed to his wife and family.

I thank the other members of the Board of management for their support and counsel and for their dedicated work for the strengthening of our community. I wish to express the Board's and the Community's deepest appreciation to our Rabbi for his leadership, wisdom amd counsel. Thanks also to the ladies who have ensured the success of our social functions, Kiddushim, Annual Shabbaton etc. A final thanks to all members of the community who have supported both myself and the synagogue throughout the year.

I wish you all a very Happy New Year and may we be blessed with ever increasing success in our endeavours for the community.
